

AATPC INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2024-2025

The Internship Program at AATPC is one that will provide both training and supervision, as well as experience working with a variety of clients using Animal Assisted Therapy. We require a <u>12-month commitment</u> of <u>20-hours</u> per week (regardless of graduation date) for clinical interns with a reduced expectation for foundation/practicum students. All interns are required to work a minimum (and maximum) of <u>5 hours</u> each weekend and at least <u>2 evenings</u> per week, as well as attend meetings and group supervision on Thursdays from <u>11:00 – 1:00</u>.

During your initial weeks, you will be given an intern orientation and training that will prepare you in both an administrative and clinical capacity for your future career. After your orientation, you may begin working with clients immediately as it is our priority to provide a maximum of 13 client hours per week for you (most interns are capped at 12-14 client hours per week). In addition to client sessions and case file management, this position will have other responsibilities, which may include administrative or administrative support work, participating in various counseling programs and groups, ranch and animal care, and programmatic support. Supervision will be provided for all tasks that are asked of you. Because this is a ranch, there is non-clinical work that is expected of all staff, including interns, to maintain the health and well-being of the animals and the cleanliness of the facility, as well as to support the non-profit.

We do not require you to work with your own animal, however, if you choose to bring an animal to work with you, it must be your own pet and they will be part of a secondary interview process. These animals must have appropriate temperament and personality and be obedience trained. For dogs: the intern must be willing to train and certify any dog they'd like to bring onsite (we can provide you this info at your request). All interns will have access to work with our variety of therapy animals who live on the ranch.

Due to our high client load and the nature of our office, we do prefer that all clinical interns have previous Practicum experience in a supervised, clinical setting, or clinical work experience.

 - o Supporting fundraising activities & volunteer events
 - o Public speaking or representing AATPC at public functions

Practicum/Foundation year duties may include:

- Coordination of/or help completing intake assessments with clients or families
- Completion of periodic and termination assessments with clients or families
- Participation in weekly clinical case meetings within our interdisciplinary team
- Distribute and be knowledgeable of community resources
- Facilitate family participation in the program, treatment plan, and discharge plan as appropriate.
- Serve as an advocate for clients and their families while maintaining a positive relationship with the community and other networking groups.
- Complete necessary documentation as required by certification, funding source, and program standards.
- Additional duties as assigned
